## Lesson 15 Gen 2

## Identifying Characteristics of the two trees

Gen 2:9 (NKJV) "And <u>out of the ground</u> the LORD God made <u>every tree</u> grow that is **pleasant to the sight and good for food**. The <u>tree of life</u> was <u>also</u> in the midst of the garden, and <u>the tree of the knowledge of good and evil."</u>

Job 1:1-3 (NKJV) "There was a man in the land of Uz, whose name was Job; and that man was blameless and upright, and one who feared God and shunned evil. [2] And seven sons and three daughters were born to him. [3] Also, his possessions were seven thousand sheep, three thousand camels, five hundred yoke of oxen, five hundred female donkeys, and a very large household, so that this man was the greatest of all the people of the East."

Job 1:8 (NKJV) "Then the LORD said to Satan, "Have you considered My servant Job, that *there is* none like him on the earth, a **blameless and upright man**, one who **fears God and shuns evil**?""

Phil 3:5-6 (NKJV) "circumcised the eighth day, of the stock of Israel, of the tribe of Benjamin, a **Hebrew of the Hebrews**; concerning the law, a Pharisee; [6] concerning zeal, persecuting the church; concerning the righteousness which is in the law, blameless."

Rom 1:17 (NKJV) "For in it [gospel] the <u>righteousness of God</u> is revealed from <u>faith to faith</u>; <u>as it is written</u>, "The just shall live by faith.""

Rom 3:21 (NKJV) "But now the <u>righteousness of God</u> <u>apart from the law is revealed</u>, being <u>witnessed by the Law and the Prophets</u>,"

Gal 5:4 (NKJV) "You have become estranged from Christ, you who attempt to be justified by law; you have fallen from grace."

Gal 2:16 (NKJV) ""knowing that a man is <u>not justified by the works of the law</u> <u>but by faith in Jesus Christ</u>, even we have believed in Christ Jesus, that we might be **justified** by faith in Christ and not by the works of the law; for by the works of the law no flesh shall be **justified."** 

Rev 3:17 (NKJV) ""Because you say, 'I am rich, have become wealthy, and have need of nothing'; and do not know that you are wretched, miserable, poor, blind, and naked;"

Psa 119:160 (NASB) "The sum of Thy word is truth, And every one of Thy righteous ordinances is everlasting."

Mat 13:52 (NKJV) "Then He said to them, "Therefore <u>every scribe instructed concerning the kingdom of heaven</u> is like a householder who **brings out of his treasure** *things* **new and old**.""

John 6:63 (NKJV) ""It is the Spirit who gives life; the flesh profits nothing. The words that I speak to you are spirit, and they are life."

Mat 4:4 (NKJV) "But He answered and said, "<u>It is written</u>, 'Man shall not live by bread alone, <u>but by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God</u>."""

Psa 14:3 (NKJV) "They have all turned aside, They have together become corrupt; *There is* none who does good, No, not one."

Psa 53:3 (NKJV) "Every one of them has turned aside; They have together become corrupt; *There is* none who does good, No, not one."

Rom 3:9-12 (NKJV) "What then? Are we better than they? Not at all. For we have previously charged both Jews and Greeks that they are all under sin. [10] As it is written: "There is none righteous, no, not one; [11] There is none who understands; There is none who seeks after God. [12] They have all turned aside; They have together become unprofitable; There is none who does good, no, not one.""

Mat 19:16-24 (NKJV) "Now behold, one came and said to Him, "Good Teacher, what good thing shall I do that I may have eternal life?" [17] So He said to him, "Why do you call Me good? No one is good but One, that is, God. But if you want to enter into life, keep the commandments." [18] He said to Him, "Which ones?" Jesus said, " 'You shall not murder,' 'You shall not commit adultery,' 'You shall not steal,' 'You shall not bear false witness,' [19] 'Honor your father and your mother,' and, 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself." [20] The young man said to Him, "All these things I have kept from my youth. What do I still lack?" [21] Jesus said to him, "If you want to be perfect, go, sell what you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and come, follow Me." [22] But when the young man heard that saying, he went away sorrowful, for he had great possessions. [23] Then Jesus said to His disciples, "Assuredly, I say to you that it is hard for a rich man to enter the kingdom of heaven. [24] "And again I say to you, it is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God.""

Job 13:15 (KJV) "Though he slay me, yet will I trust in him: but I will maintain mine own ways before him."

Job 27:1-6 (NKJV) "Moreover Job continued his discourse, and said: [2] "As God lives, who has taken away my justice, And the Almighty, who has made my soul bitter, [3] As long as my breath is in me, And the breath of God in my nostrils, [4] My lips will not speak wickedness, Nor my tongue utter deceit. [5] Far be it from me That I should say you are right; Till I die I will not put away my integrity from me. [6] My righteousness I hold fast, and will not let it go; My heart shall not reproach me as long as I live."

Job 13:15 (NIV) "Though he slay me, yet will I hope in him; **my ways to his face**."

Job 27:1-6 (NIV) "And Job continued his discourse: [2] "As surely as God lives, who <u>has denied me justice</u>, the Almighty, who has made me taste bitterness of soul, [3] as long as I have life within me, the breath of God in my nostrils, [4] my lips will not speak wickedness, and my tongue will utter no deceit. [5] I will never admit you are in the right; till I die, I will not deny my integrity. [6] I will maintain my righteousness and never let go of it; my conscience will not reproach me as long as I live."

Rom 9:31-32 (NKJV) "but Israel, <u>pursuing the law of righteousness</u>, has not attained to the law of <u>righteousness</u>. [32] Why? Because <u>they did</u> not <u>seek it</u> by faith, but as it were, by the works of the law. <u>For they stumbled at that stumbling stone</u>."

Rom 10:1-4 (NKJV) "Brethren, my heart's desire and **prayer to God for Israel** is that they may be saved. [2] For I bear them witness that **they have a zeal for God**, but not according to knowledge. [3] For **they being ignorant of God's righteousness**, and **seeking to establish their own righteousness**, have not submitted to the righteousness of God. [4] For Christ is the end [telos:G5056] of the law for righteousness to everyone who believes."

Luke 18:10-14 (NKJV) ""Two men went up to the temple to pray, one a Pharisee and the other a tax collector. [11] "The Pharisee stood and prayed thus with himself, 'God, I thank You that I am not like other men; extortioners, unjust, adulterers, or even as this tax collector. [12] I fast twice a week; I give tithes of all that I possess.' [13] "And the tax collector, standing afar off, would not so much as raise his eyes to heaven, but beat his breast, saying, 'God, be merciful to me a sinner!' [14] "I tell you, this man went down to his house justified rather than the other; for everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, and he who humbles himself will be exalted.""

Job 3:1-3 (NKJV) "After this Job opened his mouth and <u>cursed the day of his birth</u>. [2] And Job spoke, and said: [3] "May the day perish on which I was born, And the night *in which* it was said, 'A male child is conceived.""

Job 32:1-2 (NKJV) "So these three men ceased answering Job, <u>because he was righteous in his own eyes</u>. [2] Then the wrath of Elihu, the son of Barachel the Buzite, of the family of Ram, was **aroused against Job**; his wrath was aroused **because he justified himself rather than God.**"

Job 40:1-2 (NKJV) "Moreover the LORD answered Job, and said: [2] "Shall the one who contends with the Almighty correct *Him?* He who rebukes God, let him answer it.""

Job 40:6-8 (NKJV) "Then the LORD answered Job out of the whirlwind, and said: [7] "Now prepare yourself like a man; I will question you, and you shall answer Me: [8] "Would you indeed annul My judgment? Would you condemn Me that you may be justified?"

Job 40:1-2 (NIV) "The LORD said to Job: [2] "Will the one who contends with the Almighty correct him? Let him who accuses God answer him!""

Job 40:6-8 (NIV) "Then the LORD spoke to Job out of the storm: [7] "Brace yourself like a man; I will question you, and you shall answer me. [8] "Would you discredit my justice? Would you condemn me to justify yourself?"

Prophecy teacher Tim Lahaye writes:

"The church should not be expecting the Tribulation period, **but Jewish people should**. ..." Emphasis mine.

Lahaye goes on to say:

"... The church doesn't need to be tested—we have already made our decision for Christ. ... It is a mystery to me how anyone can challenge Christians to live in expectation of the Rapture if it should follow the worst period of God's wrath in history. Can a man honestly get excited about His coming if he knows that he can no longer support his family or buy food for them because he refused the mark of the Beast? A believing father during that period will watch his children starve to death.... No, the hope and comfort aspect of the Rapture DEMANDS that we ESCAPE the Tribulation, being raptured out of this world before God's wrath begins.... If Christ does not rapture His church before the Tribulation begins, much of the hope is destroyed, and thus it becomes a "blasted hope". Emphasis mine

Another Prophecy teacher, Dr. Jack Van Impe echoes the same sentiment as follows:

"This salvation from wrath cannot be the eternal deliverance from hell because the Christian already has that without Christ's return... Millions of believers are already in heaven. All who have died "in Christ" during the past two thousand years are already with Christ... For God to have 99 percent of His church with Him while 1 percent suffers untold agonies would be inconsistent... Why should a minority suffer God's vengeance while the others watch from heavenly places? ... Should 99 percent of His body in heaven rejoice while 1 percent upon earth suffers? ... Should 1 percent of the believers (constituting the Bride) languish in anguish while 99 percent abide at His side? ... Love DEMANDS that all the remaining 1 percent join the 99 percent already in His presence, ... Common sense DEMANDS it; confusion reigns without it. "3 Emphasis mine"

Jer 17:9 (KJV) "The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately wicked: who can know it?"

Rom 7:18 (NKJV) "For I know that in me (that is, in my flesh) nothing good dwells; for to will is present with me, but *how* to perform what is good I do not find."

Mat 5:48 (KJV) "Be ye therefore perfect, even as your Father which is in heaven is perfect."

Mat 5:3 (NKJV) ""Blessed *are* the **poor in spirit**, For theirs is the kingdom of heaven."

Luke 13:32 (NKJV) "And He said to them, "Go, tell that fox, 'Behold, I cast out demons and perform cures today and tomorrow, and the third day I shall be perfected."

Phil 3:12 (NKJV) "Not that I have already attained, or am already perfected; but I press on, that I may lay hold of that for which Christ Jesus has also laid hold of me."

James 1:1-4 (NKJV) "James, a bondservant of God and of the Lord Jesus Christ, To the twelve tribes which are scattered abroad: Greetings. [2] My brethren, count it all joy when you fall into various trials. [3] knowing that the testing of your faith produces patience. [4] But let patience have its perfect work, that you may be perfect and complete, lacking nothing."

James 5:10-11 (NIV) "Brothers, as an example of patience in the face of suffering, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord. [11] As you know, we consider blessed those who have persevered. You have heard of Job's perseverance and have seen what the Lord finally brought about. The Lord is full of compassion and mercy."

Eccl 7:8 (NKJV) "The end of a thing is better than its beginning; The patient in spirit is better than the proud in spirit."

Job 42:3-6 (NIV) "You asked, 'Who is this that **obscures my counsel without knowledge**?' Surely <u>I spoke of things I did not understand</u>, things too wonderful for me to know. [4] "You said, 'Listen now, and I will speak; I will question you, and you shall answer me.' [5] My ears had heard of you but now my eyes have seen you. [6] Therefore I despise myself and repent in dust and ashes.""

Deu 8:2 (NKJV) ""And you shall remember that the LORD your God <u>led you</u> all the way these forty years in the wilderness, to <u>humble you and test you</u>, to <u>know what was in your heart</u>, whether you would <u>keep His commandments</u> or not."

Deu 8:16-17 (NKJV) ""who fed you in the wilderness with manna, which your fathers did not know, that He might humble you and that He might test you, to do you good in the end; [17] "then you say in your heart, 'My power and the might of my hand have gained me this wealth.""

2 Chr 7:14 (KJV) "**If my people, which are called by my name, shall humble themselves, and pray**, and seek my face, and turn from their wicked ways; then will I hear from heaven, and will forgive their sin, and will heal their land."

John 6:28-29 (NKJV) "Then they said to Him, "What shall we do, that we may work the works of God?" [29] Jesus answered and said to them, "This is the work of God, that you believe in Him whom He sent.""

Hab 2:4 (NKJV) ""Behold the proud, His soul is not upright in him; But the just shall live by his faith."

Rom 1:17 (NKJV) "For in it the **righteousness** of God is revealed from faith to faith; as it is written, "The just shall live by faith.""

Gal 3:11 (NKJV) "But that **no one is justified by the law in the sight of God** is evident, for "the just shall live by faith.""

Rom 4:3-5 (NKJV) "For what does the Scripture say? "Abraham believed God, and it was accounted to him for righteousness." [4] Now to him who works, the wages are not counted as grace but as debt. [5] But to him who does not work but believes on Him who justifies the ungodly, his faith is accounted for righteousness,"

Phil 3:9 (NKJV) "and be found in Him, <u>not having my own righteousness</u>, <u>which is from the law</u>, but that which is through faith in Christ, the righteousness which is from God by faith;"

Mat 7:15 (NKJV) ""Beware of **false prophets**, who **come to you in sheep's clothing**, but **inwardly** they are ravenous wolves."

Mat 24:5 (NKJV) ""For many will come in My name, saying, 'I am the Christ,' and will deceive many."

1 Cor 14:3 (NKJV) "But **he who** prophesies speaks edification and exhortation and comfort to men."

Mat 4:5-6 (NKJV) "Then the devil took Him up into the holy city, set Him on the pinnacle of the temple, [6] and said to Him, "If You are the Son of God, throw Yourself down. For it is written: 'He shall give His angels charge over you,' and, 'In their hands they shall bear you up, Lest you dash your foot against a stone.""

Mat 4:7 (NKJV) "Jesus said to him, "It is written again, 'You shall not tempt the LORD your God.""

2 Cor 2:11 (NKJV) "lest Satan should take advantage of us; for we are not ignorant of his devices."

Mark 4:13 (NKJV) "And He said to them, "Do you not understand this parable? How then will you understand all the parables?"
